## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 1987 Philippine Constitution recognizes and promotes the rights of the indigenous peoples and indigenous cultural communities (ICCs/IPs) over their ancestral land and domains. Expressly, it provides that the State recognizes and promotes the rights of ICCs/IPs within the framework of national unity and development.<sup>1</sup> It also states further, that the State, subject to the provisions of the Constitution and national development policies and programs, shall protect the rights of ICCs/IPs to their ancestral lands to ensure their economic, social, and cultural well-being.<sup>2</sup>

To actualize the provisions of the above-said Constitutional provisions, Republic Act No. 8371, or the Indigenous Peoples Rights Act (IPRA) of 1997 was passed into law. The enactment of the IPRA is primarily aimed to correct historical injustices committed against the ICCs/IPs for decades past. IPRA specifically provides for the four bundles of rights namely, rights to ancestral domains, rights to self-governance and empowerment, rights to social justice and human rights, and the rights to cultural integrity. Under these four bundles, there are 36 specific rights afforded to ICCs/IPs in the country under the IPRA.

It cannot be denied that despite the earnest efforts of the NCIP in working together with other concerned agencies to recognize, respect, protect and promote the rights of the ICCs/IPs, violations of their rights continue to exist. Among these violations include the rampant selling of portions of the ICCs/IPs ancestral domains, non-compliance with the required free and prior informed consent (FPIC), and lack of basic services, as well as issues on the selection and/or installation of the Indigenous Peoples Mandatory Representatives (IPMR).

Thus, in accordance with the whole-of-nation / whole-of-government approach, the NCIP continues to call upon partner national government agencies and private institutions to assist the NCIP in putting an end to the injustices still being done against the ICCs/IPs. In this regard, after 25 years, the NCIP was able to conceptualize the framework of eleven (11) building blocks towards resilient, responsive and relevant ICCs/IPs in their ancestral domain. These building blocks include: identification, documentation, validation and confirmation of indigenous political structures and council of elders; registration and accreditation of indigenous peoples organization; certificate of ancestral domain / certificate of ancestral land delineation process; establishment of ancestral domains management office; formulation of ancestral domain sustainable development and protection plan; IP wealth management and community royalty management and development plan; institutionalization of the free and prior informed consent and exercise of priority rights process for the issuance of certification precondition; effective IPMR representation in local legislative bodies; efficient memorandum of agreement / cooperation / understanding; socio-economic works and IP cooperative undertakings; and ancestral domain defense system.

Being “*resilient*” means the ICCs/IPs can engage problems and threats, and can overcome them on their own. Being “*responsive*” means the ICCs/IPs can engage agencies/institutions whether public or private. Being “*relevant*” means the ICCs/IPs feels that they can contribute to the national security, peace and development.

With the foregoing building blocks framework, aligned with the thirteen (13) economic drivers pursuant to the current Administration’s priorities and directions, we are confident that the NCIP, together with other government agencies and stakeholders, will be able to bring the long overdue justice that our indigenous brethren truly deserve.

To commence the realization of the 11 Building Blocks, the NCIP, in partnership with the NTF-ELCAC, Mindanao Indigenous Peoples Youth Organizations (MIPYO), Mindanao Indigenous Peoples Council of Elders and Leaders (MIPCEL), and Indigenous Peoples Rights and Advocacy Center (IPRAC), successfully conducted Phase I of the Project entitled, “*Healing, Reconciliation, and Operationalizing the 11 Building Blocks in the Ancestral Domain in Support to the Whole of Government/Whole of Nation Approach by empowering the FRs, IP Youth/IP-EPs, and IP Leaders,*” which began on 6 June 2022 and ended on 8 October 2022. Phase I activities, which were undertaken in 80 areas all over Mindanao and Northern Luzon involved ancestral domains visitations to discuss burning issues with concerned ICCs/IPs. During these activities, partner agencies and institutions manifested their commitments to the operationalization of the 11 Building Blocks. In the meantime, Phase II of the Project is targeted to be implemented in CY 2023.

Because of the gains that the NCIP acquired by conducting the above-mentioned healing and reconciliation activities, on 3-10 November 2022, the NCIP hosted a series of focused-group discussions (FGDs) whereby partners agencies and private institutions were invited to discuss areas of collaboration relating to the operationalization of the 11 building blocks. These collaborative frameworks are still subject to final vetting by our partner agencies and institutions with the goal of entering into various Memoranda of Cooperation in order to implement and sustain our engagements with our partners.

On this note, we would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to our partners who attended the focused group discussions and formulated the collaborative frameworks presented in this document. We look forward to continue working together with our partner agencies and institutions for the development and welfare of the ICCs/IPs all over the country.

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## DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT & NATURAL RESOURCES

The Department of Environment & Natural Resources (DENR) is the primary agency responsible for the conservation, management, development, and proper use of the country's environment and natural resources, as well as the licensing and regulation of all natural resources as may be provided for by law in order to ensure equitable sharing of the benefits derived therefrom for the welfare of the present and future generations of Filipinos. The DENR is one of the key agencies which can help the indigenous peoples (IPs) in the development, preservation and protection of their ancestral domains/lands. In addition, the DENR undertakes to take into consideration IP rights, particularly the free and prior informed consent requirement, in the approval or grant of permit and the exercise of their regulatory powers and in the enforcement of environmental laws.

## **DEPARTMENT OF AGRARIAN REFORM**

It is the mandate of the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR) to lead in the implementation of the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Program (CARP) through Land Tenure Improvement (LTI), Agrarian Justice and Coordinated delivery of essential Support Services to client beneficiaries. The DAR shall continuously support IPs who are also agrarian reform beneficiaries or farmer-beneficiaries under the CARP. Through constant coordination with the NCIP, the DAR will also participate in harmonizing the existing legal frameworks which greatly affect the exercise of rights of IPs over their ancestral domains/lands.

Department of Justice

The Department of Justice (DOJ), the government's principal law agency serves as the government's prosecution arm and administers the government's criminal justice system by investigating crimes, prosecuting offenders and overseeing the correctional

system. Together with the NCIP at the forefront, the DOJ shall be of great help in providing assistance in investigating the burning issues and incessant violations of IP rights all over the country as well as providing relevant legal advice or opinions. The DOJ may also initiate investigation and cause the filing of cases against persons in violation of the provisions of the Indigenous Peoples' Rights Act (IPRA).

Land Registration Authority

The Land Registration Authority (LRA) is mandated to register transactions involving titled and untitled lands and personal and movable properties, and provide information on titles and registered documents. It also endeavors to protect the sanctity of the Torrens System and preserve the integrity of the land registration process, all towards providing a secure, stable and trustworthy record of land ownership that ultimately promotes social and economic well-being and contributes to national development. Registration with the LRA is a very crucial step in preserving and protecting the rights of the IPs over their ancestral lands/domains. The LRA shall also serve as an instrument in terms of protecting unregistered ancestral lands/domains against land grabbers and claimants without any legal basis for ownership.

National Bureau of Investigation

The National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) shall maintain the efficient detection and investigation of crimes and other offenses against Philippine laws. It coordinates with other national and local police agencies in the maintenance of peace and order. It also acts as a national clearing house of criminal and other information for the use of all prosecuting and law enforcement entities of the Philippines. The NBI shall provide assistance in terms of investigating violations of the IPRA, especially those which affect the exercise of the rights by the IPs, and enforcement of Cease-and-Desist Orders. The NBI may also be able of great help to the NCIP in screening proponents undergoing the Free and Prior Informed Consent (FPIC) process.

Public Attorney's Office

The Public Attorney's Office (PAO) serves as the principal law office of the Government in extending free legal assistance to indigent persons in criminal, civil, labor, administrative and other quasi-judicial cases. Lack of access and free legal services is one of the major concerns of the IPs. Free legal services will be of great help to IPs not only in terms of legal representation in criminal, civil and other types of cases but also with respect to obtaining a complete understanding of the Memorandum of Agreements they will enter into under the FPIC and other related processes.

## OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL

The Office of the Solicitor General (OSG) represents the Government of the Philippines, its agencies and instrumentalities and its officials and agents, including government-owned or controlled corporations when authorized by the President or the head of office, in any litigation, proceeding, investigation or matter requiring the services of lawyers. The OSG shall continue to provide guidance and legal assistance to the NCIP in performing its mandate and providing legal service to the IPs. The OSG, in collaboration with the DOJ, may also institute criminal and civil cases against persons in violation of the IPRA.

## NATIONAL ECONOMIC AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY PHILIPPINE STATISTICS AUTHORITY

### National Economic and Development Authority

The National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) is the government's independent socioeconomic planning body. The NEDA shall, through the NEDA Board

Investment Coordination Committee, lead in the development of a tool that will ensure compliance of proponents under the FPIC process in accordance with the IPRA. The NEDA shall also take into consideration the inclusion of Indigenous Peoples Mandatory Representative (IPMR) in local legislative bodies in the Philippine Development Plan, specifically under Chapter 16: Practice Good Governance and Improve Bureaucratic Efficiency.

### Philippine Statistics Authority

It is the responsibility of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) to plan, develop, prescribe, disseminate, and enforce policies, rules and regulations, and coordinate government-wide programs governing the production of official statistics, general purpose statistics, civil registration services and inclusive identification system. The PSA is also in-charge for all national censuses and surveys, sectoral statistics, community-based statistics, consolidation of selected administrative recording systems, and compilation of national accounts. The PSA shall provide updates to the NCIP with respect to the MOA with PSA-Censuses and Technical Coordination Office (CTCO), the 2025 Census of Population and PSA-Sectoral Statistics Office (SSO) with the inclusion of the determination of genealogy in their surveys. The PSA shall also ensure the that involvement of IPs in its projects such as the PhilSys Birth Registration Assistance Project (PBRAP), the implementation of the National ID, and in the 2025 Census of Population.

## DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The Department of Education (DepEd) formulates, implements, and coordinates policies, plans, programs and projects in the areas of formal and non-formal basic education. It supervises all elementary and secondary education institutions, including alternative learning systems, both public and private; and provides for the establishment and maintenance of a complete, adequate, and integrated system of basic education relevant to the goals of national development. The DepEd, through the IPEd shall continue to endeavor to enhance present curriculums being implemented in schools in order to enrich the knowledge and competence of students as to the existing IP political structures and customary practices, as well as socio economic activities which are responsive to their community needs and cultural heritage.

### **PHILIPPINE INFORMATION AGENCY**

The mandate of the Philippine Information Agency (PIA) is to disseminate information about government programs, projects, and services to the Filipino public, with the final goal of improving their quality, thus empowering them to participate in the country's democratic processes. The PIA shall assist the NCIP in promoting and disseminating through various media the available processes and benefits which the IPs may avail of which shall be beneficial in the exercise of their rights. Likewise, the PIA can help in producing creative content that promote the rights of the ICCs/IPs. The PIA may further support NCIP in conducting information, education and communication campaigns in order to capacitate the IPs themselves as regards their rights they are entitled to under the IPRA,



enabling them to utilize their resources efficiently and preserve and protect their rights and properties.

With the infiltration of community terrorist groups and other organizations into ancestral domains, there is a definite need to defend these areas to maintain safety and safeguard the territorial and cultural integrity of the ICCs/IPs.

Armed Forces of the Philippines

The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) is responsible for upholding the sovereignty of the country, supporting its Constitution, and defending its territory against all enemies. It is composed of the Philippine Army, the Philippine Navy, and the Philippine Air Force. The AFP undertakes to counter communist terrorist groups (CTG) and underground mass organizations (UGMO), as well as the Guerilla Front Committee for Horizontal and Vertical Development, the CTG's Red Area and White Area Interplay, CTG's Rebolusyonyong Buwis sa Kaaway na Uri and other activities/projects which prevent the IPs from freely exercising their rights provided under the IPRA and which compromise the security and safety of the ICCs/IPs inside their respective ancestral lands/domains.

Considering that ICCs/IPs are one of the most vulnerable sectors affected by natural disasters arising from climate change, the CCC shall take into consideration the involvement of the IPs in the National Climate Change Action Plan. The CCC undertakes to assist in capacitating IPs in terms of awareness as regards the harmful effects of climate change and also possible climate change mitigation and adaptation projects which may be implemented in their ancestral domains.

The Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) is the prime agency responsible for the pursuit of the State's foreign policy. The DFA advises and assists the President in planning, coordinating, and evaluating the total national effort in the field of foreign relations. The DFA undertakes to promote the IPRA at the Human Rights Council and the United Nations General Assembly. The DFA shall also continue to coordinate with other national government agencies and support all processes and programs established for the purpose of promoting the rights of the IPs.

The National Housing Authority (NHA) is a government-owned and controlled corporation under the administrative supervision of the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development. The NHA's function is to develop and implement a comprehensive and integrated housing development and resettlement; fast track the determination and development of government lands suitable for housing; as well as ensure the sustainability of socialized housing funds by improving its collection efficiency, among others. The NHA undertakes to create IP Housing projects for ICCs/IPs within their CADT per request. NHA shall also strive to provide financial assistance and dormitories to IP students studying in state universities and colleges and provide relocation sites to IP informal settlers in urban areas.

It shall also offer trainings, capacity-buildings, and projects related to Water Access, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) to the IPs/ICCs. ### **COMMISSION ON AUDIT**

While COA has no direct buy-in in the programs, projects and activities of the NCIP, the NCIP-COA Audit Team will see to it that the NCIP Central and Regional Offices that the fundamental principles as mentioned above are observed in all financial transactions incurred by the agency.

The Team will continue to review all financial transactions on the implementation of its programs, projects and activities intended for the operationalization of the ICCs/ IPs 11 Building Blocks, be fully implemented in accordance to plans and corresponding funds be properly utilized in accordance to the COA rules and regulation.

### **NATIONAL ANTI-POVERTY COMMISSION**

The National Anti-Poverty Commission (NAPC) aims to institutionalize basic sector participation in the formulation, planning, implementation, and monitoring of anti-poverty policies, strategies, and programs in line with the Social Reform Agenda. NAPC undertakes to lobby for increase in budget allocation for IPS documentation and include the ADSDPP in local development plans. The NAPC commits to forge a MOA/MOU on institutional partnership/support for the NAPC-IPSC's activities including but not limited to conduct of regular quarterly meetings, inter-agency and bilateral meetings, consultations, and IECs.

The Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) is the government agency responsible for the development, improvement, management and conservation of the country's fisheries and aquatic resources. BFAR shall include the ICCs/IPs in their programs such as Fisheries Scholarship Program and conduct capacity building activities in aquaculture, capture fisheries, postharvest and marketing technologies to empower beneficiary IPs.

Philippine Coconut Authority

The primary concern of the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) is the promotion of the rapid integrated development and growth of the coconut and other palm oil industry in all its aspects and to ensure that the coconut farmers become direct participants in, and beneficiaries of, such development and growth. The PCA undertakes to provide ICC/IP beneficiaries agricultural inputs for coconut farming and to identify ancestral lands/domains with existing coconut plantations or production to provide appropriate interventions.

The CDA shall assist IP organizations in registering as cooperative. The CDA also plans to provide trainings to IPs in support of enhancing their ancestral domains defense system.

## **TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY**

Department of Energy

The Department of Energy (DOE) is mandated to prepare, integrate, coordinate, supervise and control all plans, programs, projects and activities of the government relative to energy exploration, development, utilization, distribution and conservation. The DOE shall coordinate with the NCIP regarding the inclusion of ICCs/IPs under the DOE's Benefits to Host Communities Program and other projects. It shall also strengthen its partnership with NCIP with respect to the conduct of the FPIC process for energy projects, especially projects of national significance. The DOE shall also discuss with NCIP how it may provide support to the ICCs/IPs in relation to possible access to renewable energy projects such as geothermal, hydroelectric, and wind sources to support economic activities.

National Electrification Administration

The National Electrification Administration (NEA) focuses on strengthening its partners in the rural electrification program, the electric cooperatives, by ensuring that they become more efficient, reliable and globally competitive. The NEA shall conduct studies on expanding electrical supply to rural areas where ICCs/IPs are situated. It shall also install Solar Home Systems that target dispersed households with no access to grid facility and adopt hybrid power facilities such as combination of renewable energy sources and diesel generators to community service centers, public schools, health centers that are near and accessible to the ICCs/IPs. The NEA shall also hold IEC campaigns that aim to capacitate and inform the ICCs/IPs and NCIP offices of the implementing rules, policy and guidelines on Renewable Energy Programs of NEA.

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## DEPARTMENT OF TOURISM

The Department of Tourism is the primary government agency charged with the responsibility to encourage, promote, and develop tourism as a major socio-economic activity to generate foreign currency and employment and to spread the benefits of tourism to both the private and public sector. Considering that several prime tourism sites in the country are situated within the ancestral domains, the DOT is in the position to provide assistance to ICCs/IPs in generating livelihoods and income brought forth by local and international tourism activities. Among DOT's collaborations with NCIP involve accreditation, industry skills training, tourism planning, product development, marketing and promotions, tourism infrastructure, and inclusion of IPO representatives in the Tourism Coordinating Council, to name a few DOT also recognizes the need to protect the ADs in order to strengthen tourism development in the country.

Confirmation of IPS	Per Republic Act No. 9593 (otherwise known as the Tourism Act of 2009) and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), a representative from recognized Indigenous Peoples federation is a member of the Tourism Coordinating Council (TCC), which serves as the coordinating body for national tourism development effort; On the sub-national level, the Tourism Guidebook for Local Government Units recommends to include People's Organizations active in tourism areas, as well as relevant sectoral representatives, in the tourism planning process (e.g. IPs, vulnerable, marginalized groups); Moving forward, while NCIP has been previously invited to TCC meetings, NCIP may be included in the formal roster of TCC membership to cement convergence/cooperation between our Agencies (once review/amendment of the Tourism Act is undertaken).

Socio-economic Activities and IP Cooperatives	All services from the DOT and its Attached Agencies are available to ICCs/IPs. Due regard will be provided in the conduct of these services/activities, in consideration of the special needs, requirement, and circumstances;

	Specifically, ICCs/IPs may avail/request for: Accreditation, Industry skills training, Tourism planning, Product development, Marketing and promotions, Tourism infrastructure, etc.
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## **DEVELOPMENT BANK OF THE PHILIPPINES**

The Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP), the country's pre-eminent development financial institution, aims to provide banking services principally to cater to the medium and long-term needs of agricultural and industrial enterprises with emphasis on small and medium-scale industries. The DBP undertakes to assist NCIP in capacity building activities such as financial literacy trainings, provision of banking services regarding property utilization of royalties as well as access to credit programs.
